Pastoral Perspective from Previous Presidential Promotions of Providential Progress

Over eighty years ago on Christmas Day, 1943, soon after President Franklin D. Roosevelt appointed him Supreme Commander of Allied Expeditionary Force, General Dwight D. Eisenhower with Prime Minister Winston Churchill alongside senior British and American officers gathered among leadership together for the Allies in Europe during World War II. From humble beginnings in the U.S. heartland at the center of the North American continent, "Ike" served the people of this country along with other nations on earth, eventually serv-

ing as leader of the free world. A photograph with FDR (November 25, 1943, Cairo, Egypt) is shown here from the Eisenhower Presidential Library and Museum in Abilene, Kansas.

Upon subsequent service in various capacities following the end of WWII, including President of Columbia University and first Supreme Commander of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), Dwight David Eisenhower served two consecutive terms as President of the United States. An excerpt from his speech at the start of his administration, which he began with a personal prayer, is at times quoted for reflection on posterity.

"History does not long entrust the care of freedom to the weak or the timid."

—Dwight D. Eisenhower, 34th President of the United States of America, First Inaugural Address, 1953

In a related excerpt, a verse from scripture in the New Testament comes to mind as the apostle Paul writes to Timothy with heartfelt encouragement to bear upon mentoring a beloved protégé in faith.

"For God has not given us a spirit of timidity, but of power and love and discipline."

—2 Timothy 1:7 (NASB)

We in Christ have been given strength of courage in spirit to persist, persevere, and prevail through thick and thin, upon times of challenge and need, in plenty and in want, no matter come what may. At this season of

Thanksgiving after celebrating All Saints' and Reformation Day into Advent and Christmastide, may we continue moving forward in faith having such in mind, even as Paul preceded his remark above with these words written below over tears of joy and longing in recollection.

"For I am mindful of the sincere faith within you, which first dwelt in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am sure that it is in you as well. For this reason, I remind you to kindle afresh the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands."

As ones who are accompanied by holy love and spiritual discipline with divine wisdom and power from on high, we are blessed to share blessings even more along with all the saints of our ancestors before us to continue keeping on keeping on keeping the faith. Thanks be to God.
