As I write, I am watching a video of the youngest of my six grandchildren for the first time taking their first steps walking on their own as we celebrate the day marking one year following their date of birth. Beauteous beloved bliss to behold and be blessed upon this bounteous birthday blessing! Being one myself, there is joyfulness in the experience of a December baby born to us!

If I may remark on this happy event of such a precious little one's life early on in their tender childhood, it is a singularly joyous occasion by which one can take to heart with pastoral sensitivity upon deepened reflection the grandeur of heavenly parental context from generation to generation. May we indeed be found faithful in the sight of the holy and anointed One who calls us for the sake of the good news we endeavor to spread toward blessing the world that God so loves through us in this life and that which is yet to come.




